- Miyajima, Takashi, and Takamichi Kajita. (eds.) (1996) *Gaikokujin Roudousha kara Shimin he [From Foreign Workers to Citizens]* (Tokyo: Yuuhikaku).
Miyajima and Kajita's volume examines different aspects of the integration process and how they become citizens.
- Miyajima, Takashi. (2003) *Tomo ni Ikirareru Nihon he [Living Together: Policies for Foreign Residents in Japan]* (Tokyo: Yuuhikaku).
- Yorimitsu, Masatoshi. (ed.) (2005) *Nihon no Iminseiaku wo Kangaeru [Immigration Policies in Japan]* (Tokyo: Akashi Shoten).
Yorimitsu demonstrates that foreign nationals in Japan are an integral part of the Japanese economy and proposes various immigration policies to resolve problems they face in Japan.
- Miyajima, Takashi. (ed.) *Gaikokujin Shimin to Seiji Sanka [Foreign Residents and their Participation in Politics]* (Tokyo: Yushindo).
This book examines the degrees of integration of foreign residents in Japan from the perspective of politics and culture.
- Kajita, Takamichi, Kiyoto Tanno and Naoto Higuchi. (2005) *Kao no Mienai Teijuka [Invisible Residents]* (Nagoya: Nagoya University Press).
This book offers a comprehensive analysis of the process by which foreign residents become integrated into Japanese society as invisible labourers.
- Kondou, Atsushi, Yoshikazu Shiobara and Eriko Suzuki. (eds.) (2010) *Hiseiki Taizaisha to Zairyuu Tokubetsu Kyoka [Irregular Migrants and Special Permission for Residency]* (Tokyo: Nippon Hyouron-sha).
This edited volume looks at irregular migrants and legal and social obstacles they face in Japan.
